

## Employment: - Number of created Jobs in month of October 2013

A total number of 779 jobs were created in the month of October 2013, the term “created” is limited to advertised jobs in formal press such as all published newspapers and job internet sites casting jobs in Rwanda. These included temporary and permanent jobs as is explained below.

In terms of sectors, there are 21 economic sectors (ISIC 08), most of the jobs were created in the Public administration, Professional, Scientific and Technical services, Education and Health services respectively, whereas the least number of jobs were created in Arts, entertainment and recreation, and real estate activities, for details, see table below.

## Permanent Jobs

635 permanent jobs were created in the month of October, with public sector accounting for 72.8%, while the professionals were the most demanded for skilled labour units with a proportion of 70.9%, For details see tables (Table4) and (Table2) below.

In terms of ownership, the public sector created the most jobs with a proportion of 72.8%, NGO, 15.0%, Private sector 6.8% whereas the parastatal created 5.5% of the jobs, for details see table below.

### Temporary Jobs/Consultancy Jobs

A total of 144 temporary/ consultancy jobs were created in October with the public sector generating 78.5% of the jobs, private sector 11.1%, parastatal institutions 1.4% while NGOs 9.0%. All the created jobs required professionals with most requiring master's degrees in the respective areas.
